APPLICATION FOR AN ORDER APPROVING THE RETENTION OF ALSTON & BIRD LLP AS COUNSEL TO THE OFFICIAL COMMITTEE OF UNSECURED CREDITORS

The Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors appointed in the above-captioned chapter 11 cases (the "Committee") submits this application (the "Application") for an order approving the employment and retention of Alston & Bird LLP as counsel to the Committee pursuant to section 1103(a) of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code") and rule 2014 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure (the "Bankruptcy Rules").

In support of this Application, the Committee submits the declaration of Martin G. Bunin (the "Bunin Declaration"), attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference, and respectfully represents as follows:

JURISDICTION

1. This Court has jurisdiction over this Application pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1334. This is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b). Venue of this proceeding within this district is proper pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409.

BACKGROUND AND RELIEF REQUESTED

- 2. On May 29, 2013 (the "Petition Date"), Sound Shore Medical Center of Westchester, The Mount Vernon Hospital, Howe Avenue Nursing Home, Inc., The M.V.H. Corporation, Sound Shore Health System, Inc., NRHMC Services Corporation, and New Rochelle Sound Shore Housing, LLC (collectively, the "Debtors") filed voluntary petitions for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code. The Debtors continue to operate their businesses and manage their property as debtors in possession pursuant to sections 1107(a) and 1108 of the Bankruptcy Code.
- 3. On May 31, 2013, the Court entered an order consolidating the Debtors' cases for procedural purposes only and ordering their joint administration under the caption above. (Docket No. 30.)
- 4. On June 10, 2013, the United States Trustee appointed the Committee pursuant to section 1102 of the Bankruptcy Code. The Committee is currently comprised of the following members: (i) Westchester County Health Care Corporation (Committee Chair), (ii) Health/ROI, (iii) Ocean Side Institutional Industries, Inc., (iv) New York State Nurses Association, and (v) 1199SEIU National Benefit Fund for Health & Human Services Employees and 1199SEIU Health Care Employees Pension Fund. Later that day, the Committee selected Alston & Bird LLP as its counsel.
- 5. The Committee has selected the firm of Alston & Bird LLP as its counsel because of the expertise and experience of the firm's attorneys in bankruptcy cases and, specifically, in

representing creditors' committees in chapter 11 cases. Attorneys at Alston & Bird LLP in New York have previously represented or currently represent creditors' committees in more than twenty chapter 11 cases filed by hospitals and other health care providers. Furthermore, Alston & Bird LLP's broad-based practice, which includes expertise in the areas of health care, finance, litigation, tax and real estate, as well as bankruptcy, will permit it to represent fully the interests of the Committee in an efficient and effective manner. Alston & Bird LLP has offices in New York, California (Los Angeles, Silicon Valley, and Ventura County), Atlanta, Washington, D.C., Dallas, and North Carolina (Charlotte and Raleigh).

- 6. Alston & Bird LLP is expected to render such legal services as the Committee may consider desirable to discharge the Committee's responsibilities and further the interests of the Committee's constituents in these cases. In addition to acting as primary spokesperson for the Committee, it is expected that Alston & Bird LLP's services will include, without limitation, assisting, advising, and representing the Committee with respect to the following matters:
 - (a) The administration of these cases and the exercise of oversight with respect to the Debtors' affairs including all issues arising from or impacting the Debtors or the Committee in these chapter 11 cases;
 - (b) The preparation on behalf of the Committee of all necessary applications, motions, orders, reports, and other legal papers;
 - (c) Appearances in this Court to represent the interests of the Committee;
 - (d) The negotiation, formulation, drafting, and confirmation of any plan of reorganization or liquidation and matters related thereto;
 - (e) The exercise of oversight with respect to any transfer, pledge, conveyance, sale, or other liquidation of the Debtors' assets;
 - (f) Such investigation as the Committee may desire concerning, among other things, the assets, liabilities, financial condition, and operating issues concerning the Debtors that may be relevant to this case;

- (g) Such communication with the Committee's constituents and others as the Committee may consider desirable in furtherance of its responsibilities; and
- (h) The performance of all of the Committee's duties and powers under the Bankruptcy Code and the Bankruptcy Rules or as may be ordered by the Court.
- 7. Alston & Bird LLP has indicated its willingness to serve as counsel to the Committee herein and to receive compensation on an hourly basis, subject to the approval of this Court and compliance with sections 330 and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code, the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, the Local Bankruptcy Rules, the United States Trustee's Guidelines for Fees and Disbursements issued by the Office of the United States Trustee, and such other procedures as may be fixed by order of this Court, for professional services rendered and expenses incurred by Alston & Bird LLP. The current hourly rates charged by Alston & Bird LLP for attorneys and paralegals are set forth in the Bunin Declaration.
- 8. To the best of the Committee's knowledge, information, and belief (and consistent with the Bunin Declaration), Alston & Bird LLP is a "disinterested person" as that term is defined in section 101(14) of the Bankruptcy Code in that Alston & Bird LLP:
 - (a) is not a creditor, an equity security holder, or an insider;
 - (b) is not and was not, within two years before the date of the filing of the petition, a director, officer, or employee of the Debtors; and
 - (c) does not have an interest materially adverse to the interest of the estates or of any class of creditors or equity security holders, by reason of any direct or indirect relationship to, connection with, or interest in, the Debtors, or for any other reason.
- 9. It is the carefully considered view of the Committee that, taking into account the facts of these cases and the various interests involved, representation of the Committee by Alston & Bird LLP is appropriate and advisable. To the best of the Committee's knowledge, information, and belief (and consistent with the Bunin Declaration), Alston & Bird LLP

represents no interest adverse to the Committee or the Debtors' estates which would preclude it from acting as counsel to the Committee in the matters upon which it is to be engaged.

- 10. Based on the foregoing, the employment of Alston & Bird LLP by the Committee is necessary, would be in the best interests of the Committee and the Debtors' estates and complies with section 1103 of the Bankruptcy Code.
- 11. Alston & Bird LLP commenced performing services for the Committee on June 10, 2013, the day Alston & Bird LLP was selected to represent the Committee in these cases. Accordingly, the Committee respectfully requests that the retention of Alston & Bird LLP be authorized *nunc pro tunc*, effective as of June 10, 2013.
- 12. No previous application for the relief requested herein has been made to this or any other Court.

WHEREFORE, the Committee respectfully requests that the Court enter an order substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B approving the retention of Alston & Bird LLP by the Committee to perform the services described herein, *nunc pro tunc* to June 10, 2013, and granting such other and further relief as the Court may deem just and proper.

- 2. - 3. Bunin, Esq. attached to the Application as Exhibit A (the "Bunin Declaration"); and it appearing that Alston & Bird LLP is a disinterested person pursuant to section 101(14) of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code") and does not represent an interest adverse to the Committee or the Debtor's estate with respect to the matters on which Alston & Bird LLP is to be employed; it is

ORDERED, that the Application is granted as set forth herein; and it is further

ORDERED, that the retention of Alston & Bird LLP as counsel for the Committee to perform all of the services set forth in the Application on the terms set forth in the Application and the Bunin Declaration is hereby approved pursuant to section 1103(a) of the Bankruptcy Code effective as of June 10, 2013; and it is further

ORDERED, that the compensation to be paid to Alston & Bird LLP shall be subject to the approval of this Court pursuant to sections 330 and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code, the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, the Local Bankruptcy Rules, the United States Trustee's Guidelines for Fees and Disbursements issued by the Office of the United States Trustee, and 13-22840-rdd Doc 152-2 Filed 07/03/13 Entered 07/03/13 14:58:39 Exhibit B Pg 3 of 3

such other procedures as may be fixed by order of this Court, for professional services rendered

and expenses incurred by Alston & Bird LLP; and it is further

ORDERED, that to the extent the Application is inconsistent with this Order, the terms

of this Order shall govern.
